**Community Preservation Committee Now Accepting Project Applications
Deadline for Applications is October 1, 2015**

SCITUATE, Mass, July 10, 2015 - The Scituate Community Preservation Committee (CPC) is now accepting applications for projects to be considered for approval at the 2016 Annual Town Meeting. Applications for Funding are accepted throughout the year, but applications received by **October 1, 2015** will be eligible for consideration at the 2016 Annual Town Meeting. Project applications will be considered by the Committee at its regularly scheduled public hearings beginning in November. Applications voted on favorably by the Committee will be recommended by the Committee to Town Meeting. The CPC also announced today that they looking for candidates to update their current website, which was designed in 2007. The Committee will be interviewing potential candidates at the August 10th meeting at the GAR Hall at 7:00 PM. The CPC will hold an annual Public Information Meeting on September 14, 2015. Residents who would like to learn more about the CPC are encouraged to attend.

The Community Preservation Act was adopted by Scituate voters in 2002. CPA funds are used for open space protection, historic preservation, affordable housing and outdoor recreation.

If you have a project that meets the CPA guidelines and requires funding, we encourage all applicants to submit their project for consideration. If you have any questions, please feel free to attend a CPC meeting, which normally occur at 7:00 PM on the 2nd Monday of each month at the GAR Hall.
